






Municipal ZNE Assistance

• Technical Assistance: No-cost engineering analysis to help local governments explore what it would take for municipal buildings to become ZNE, or to demonstrate ZNE policy feasibility for municipal building portfolios.



• Municipal ZNE RFP and OPR Template Language: Request for proposal (RFP) and owner project requirements (OPR) template language for local governments to encourage developers to construct new municipal buildings to ZNE.

- Replacing all or part of a roof
- Replacing or adding new windows
